



I want to start off by thanking everyone who came out to the Grown & Sexy party at Funky Buddha. Judging by the crowd's reactions, it was a great time for everyone. I hope to see you back on April 15 at the next event. Before moving on to the reviews this week, I want to give a special kudos to DJ George G of Wild Tuesdays at Hydrate. After my night of work, his high-octane style provided a great night cap on what was already a good night.

The first release I want to spotlight is the new **Dan-ity Kane** album. I had very high expectations for the album. However, beyond a few standouts, I don't think Welcome To the Dollhouse is really crisp enough. It's good, but sample a few songs before committing to the purchase at Target, where the set comes with a bonus track.

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
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Nightspots speaks with Gary Airedale, ringmaster of The Flesh Hungry Dog Show, Jackhammer's monthly rock and/or roll showcase. On April 4, The Flesh Hungry Dog Show celebrates its third anniversary with perennial favorites The Joans, the über-homo Bric-A-Brac and, in their last performance ever, Jinx Titanic.

Join us, won't you, as we talk to Gary about queer rock, macho pussies and that one time he burned the crowd alive...

Flesh Hungry Dog started as a band. What made you decide to turn it into a show?

I decided to turn it into a show when I was exploring my nightlife options. There seemed to be a lack of the kind of events that I'd like to go to, so I had to create it from scratch. Fausto Fernos used to do "The Feast of Fools" and that was a big, inspirational eye-opener for me. After I spent years asleep at the wheel at the usual gay bars, I saw that were other people like me hungry for an alternative to disco and showtunes... not that there's anything wrong with that.

What advantages do you see in doing the show at a place like Jackhammer as opposed to a bigger, more musical venue?

The people at Jackhammer—the staff and management—are just awesome. They're the nicest and most honest people you'd ever want to work with. My limited experience working with music venues hasn't been so great: shady business practices, greed, basically taking advantage of artists any way they could. Jackhammer isn't always ideal as a space, but it's got a great vibe, they're extremely supportive, and I think our audience feels comfortable there.
